PROFESSOR J.A. ADELEYE NATIONAL INTER-MEDICAL SCHOOL ESSAY COMPETITION

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS AND ONGOING PROJECTS

41st General Edition of the Journal

In honour of the 60th Anniversary, the Board is preparing the 41st General Edition of the DOKITA Journal. With 20 peer-reviewed articles currently under review, two issues are planned for release: December 2024 and early 2025.

Journal Digitization and Accessibility

The Board achieved a significant milestone by indexing the DOKITA Journal on African Journals Online (AJOL) and acquiring an E-ISSN for electronic distribution. Training on the Open Journal System (OJS) has equipped members with the skills to manage this digitization process. Efforts continue to recover missing editions, including Volumes 4, 5, 6, 7 no. 1, 13, 16, 17, and 24. To this end we plead that

anyone who happens to still be in possession of these editions should please reach out to the Board so that the editions can be digitized.

Competitions and Events

The 10th Late Emeritus Professor O.O. Akinkugbe Inter-Medical School Quiz Competition: The University of Ibadan emerged victorious in the intermedical school quiz Competition, with Obafemi Awolowo University and the University of Nigeria as first and second runners-up, respectively.

The 10th Professor J.A. Adeleye Essay Competition: This year's topic, **"The Impact of Hyperinflation on Nigeria's Health Sector: Challenges and Opportunities,"** has drawn nationwide participation, thanks to support from the Adeleye family.

52nd Annual Symposium

Scheduled for December 2024, this year's theme is "Contemporary Threats to Nigeria's Public Health: Infectious Diseases, Flooding, and Research Funding Deficits."

Research Webinar 2.0

The Board is organizing a webinar to strengthen research capacity among medical students.

Community Engagement and Journal Distribution

In a bid to increase accessibility, journals are now distributed for free to medical students across all levels, with plans to sustain the initiative through a proposed capitation fee for dues-paying members.

Boardroom Renovations and Alumni Support

The Board room has undergone significant renovations. This initiative was sponsored by generous alumni contribution of N150,000 from Dr Oladunni Filani, a former Editor-in-Chief (2000). The Board also received a generous donation of \$1,400 from Dr. Femi Agbayewa, a former Editor-in-Chief (1974). These efforts have created a conducive environment for members to collaborate.



Virtual Alumni Hangout and Collaborations

The Board hosted a successful Virtual Alumni Hangout, themed "Yesterday's Dreams, Today's Realities, and Tomorrow's Vision." The event fostered mentorship opportunities as alumni shared insights and inspired current members.

Additionally, discussions are underway for collaborations with the Annals of Ibadan Postgraduate Medicine to further enhance the Board's academic contributions.
