#### **1. Overview of DOVVSU**

- a) The unit was established as Women and Juvenile Unit (WAJU) in October 1998;
- b) It was renamed Domestic Violence and Victim Support Unit (DOVVSU) in 2005;
- c) It is a specialised unit under the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of the Ghana Police Service to handle domestic violence and child abuse issues;
- d) It Operates in the eleven (11) regions of the service, with about one hundred and ten (110) offices and desks nationwide.

### 2. Objectives

- a) Investigate domestic violence and child abuse cases;
- b) Handle cases involving Juveniles;
- c) Provide support for victims of abuse;
- d) Arrest and prosecute offenders/perpetrators.

#### 3. Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

GBV is violence that is directed against a person on the basis of gender or sex. It includes acts that inflict physical, mental or sexual harm.

Women, men, boys and girls can be victims of gender-based violence, but women and girls are the primary victims everywhere.

#### **8.1 Proactive Measures**

- a) Sensitization programs churches, mosques, schools, communities, etc.;
- b) Capacity building for personnel on case management, prosecutions, human rights, customer care, electronic evidence, etc.;

c) Coordination/collaboration with others- MGCSP/CSOs/UN Agencies etc to implement strategies on violence prevention activities.

#### 8.2 Reactive Measures

- a) Investigations;
- b) Prosecutions;
- c) Protection of victims/vulnerable adults (shelter);
- d) Counselling services.

## 9. Challenges

- a) Difficulty in breaking through the walls of religion/belief/culture or tradition;
- b) Delay in reporting abuse because a pastor/imam/traditional leader says it is against their belief;
- c) Some victims/survivors fear their marriage will break up when an abuse is reported to the Police;
- d) Some perpetrators refer to reporting of abuse as the reason for ending their relationship;
- e) Stigmatisation within the community and especially churcheswhen some victims/survivors are made to sit on the back row in church for a stipulated period of time;
- f) Family members also push for relations to seek for divorce when a report of abuse is made against their brother or sister;
- g) Complainants, victims and witnesses refuse to appear and testify in court during prosecution.

## **10.** Conclusion

- a) Let's make the available space we have a safe place for abused women, children and men to seek help or support;
- b) Don't be quick to condemn or judge the individual because what the person may need at that time or moment is care;

c) Continue educating the public to prevent Gender-Based Violence or report any if we happen to hear about such abuses because if we do not, it may lead to serious injury or death of someone.
